Aims & objectives



The Passivhaus Trust aims to:

- Preserve the integrity of Passivhaus standards and methodology
- 2: Promote Passivhaus principles to the industry and Government
- 3: Undertake research and development on Passivhaus standards in the UK

Structure



The Passivhaus Trust is:

1: A not-for-profit organisation

2: A subsidiary company of the AECB


3: An affiliate of the PassivHaus Institute, through the International Passive House Association (iPHA)

Governance



The Passivhaus Trust is advised by:

- 1: A Board of Directors representing a cross-section of interests in the Passivhaus field
- 2: An Advisory Council of acknowledged PH and low-energy experts
- 3: A Technical Panel (& working groups) of technical specialists, advising on specific aspects of PH application

The Passivhaus Trust runs a core programme:

1: Research and guidance

- technical working groups e.g. UK weather data

2: Education and training

- introductory events, site visits & technical masterclasses

3: Policy, lobbying & promotion

- relationship of PH to UK policy e.g. zero carbon definitions

- 1: A press launch at the UK Passivhaus Conference on 11th October
- 2: Further recruitment to add to our 10 Founder Members & 20 others (so far!)
- 3: A first meeting of technical working groups on zero carbon and UK weather date on the morning of 12th october
- 4: A series of site visits on 12th 14th November, as part of the International Passive House visits series

- 1: A technical masterclass this winter, to explore detailed application of Passivhaus Principles
- 2: A Passivhaus zone/ lecture theatre at Ecobuild 2011
