Making successful places that don't rely on the private car

## The density gradient

Area	Units/Ha	Persons/Ha
Low density detached - Hertfordshire	5	20
Average density of new development in UK (1981-1991)	22	88
Minimum density for a bus service	25	100
Minimum density for a tram service	60	240
Sustainable urban density	69	275
Average net density Islington - 1965	185	740

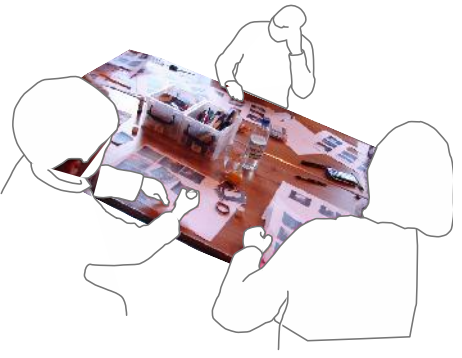
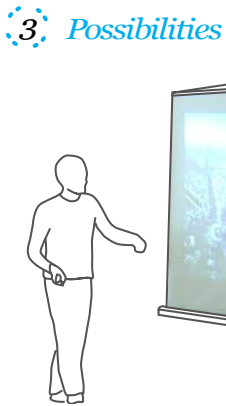
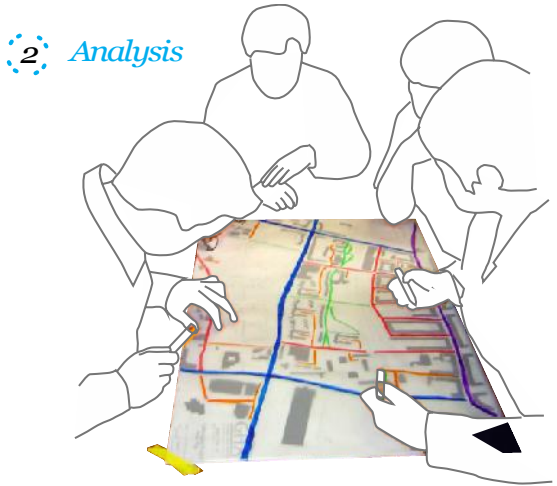
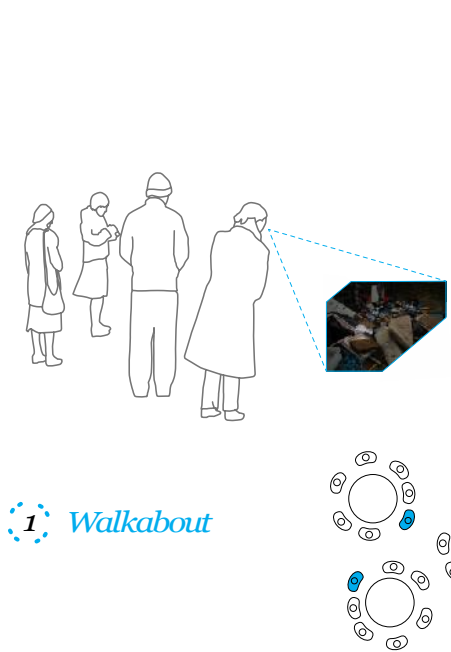
